

Installing the Painting Assistant Panel.

Please note this panel can only be used with Adobe Photoshop CS5.

Automated installation on Mac or Windows®:

1. Close the Adobe Photoshop CS5 application if it is currently running.
2. Open the Adobe Extension Manager CS5 that was installed with Photoshop.
3. Select the install button at the top of the Extension Manger window.
4. Locate, and select, the file named Painting Assistant.zxp
5. Follow the instructions and install the panel.
6. If you have any installation issues, please refer to the manual installation instructions.

In some cases the Adobe Extension Manager CS5 will not correctly install all the components of the Painting Assistant into the correct locations.

If you are experiencing problems after running the installer then use this information to help with a manual installation. Once you have installed these files you can access the Painting Assistant panel from the Window Menu / Extensions.

You will need to restart Adobe Photoshop CS5 after installing these files. Also, be sure that you are in Administrator Mode when installing, or coping this panel. If you are not in Administrator Mode, some files will not be copied correctly.

Manual Installation on Mac or Windows®:

1. Locate the folder called Painting Assistant in the Manual Installation folder.
2. Place this folder and contents in the following system locations:

On a Mac use this path:

Applications / Adobe Photoshop CS5 / Plug-ins / Panels / (Painting Assistant folder and contents goes here)

On Windows® use this path:

Programs / Adobe Photoshop CS5 / Plug-ins / Panels / (Painting Assistant folder and contents goes here)

Start Adobe Photoshop CS5 and access the Painting Assistant panel from the Window Menu / Extensions.

3. Locate the file named Painting Assistant Presets.tpl in the Manual Installation folder. Select the Mixer Brush from the Tools Panel, and then load this preset from the Tool Presets fly out menu. This step must be completed before you can start to paint.
